Live

The place

Think rugged coastlines paired with remote island life. A region of beautiful beaches, amazing culture, relaxed lifestyle and invigorating wildlife trails.

The town of Nhulunbuy on the Gove Peninsula is the largest centre in the region. Nhulunbuy operates as a service and business hub for the area and has a population of around 4,000 people making it the sixth largest place in the Northern Territory of Australia.

Nhulunbuy was created in the late 1960s when a bauxite mine was established, utilising the natural deep water port, followed by an alumina refinery.

Throughout the region, there are more than 100 homelands = that are home to mostly Aboriginal people with populations ranging from 10 to 200 people. Yolngu are the traditional owners of East Arnhem Land and share a strong connection with the region.

There are a few small towns in the region, such as Nhulunbuy and Yirrkala, but most of the population lives in remote communities. The region is sparsely populated, with a total population of just over 14,000 people.

There are plenty of opportunities for outdoor activities such as fishing, camping, and bushwalking. The region is also home to some of the best Aboriginal art in the world.

Weather

Broadly speaking East Arnhem has 2 seasons - the dry and the wet, although Yolnu culture articulates a more nuanced understanding of the weather cycles, where six seasons are observed.

During the dry season residents enjoy sunny, breezy days paired with blue skies. With average temps around 30° days and 20° nights. The humidity drops to a comfortable 60-65%, making it the perfect conditions for outdoor living.

The wet season generally commences around November and ends towards the end of April. Temperatures can reach mid-30° with the increase in humidity triggering refreshing monsoonal rains combined with spectacular thunder and lightning storms, followed by a drop in humidity and temperatures.

Transport

Gove Airport is situated about 15km from Nhulunbuy with a commercial airport and Airnorth operating daily flights to both Cairns and Darwin. The approximate time to Darwin is one hour and Cairns 1.5 hours.

The Central Arnhem Road connects Nhulunbuy with the Stuart Highway just south east of Katherine. This road is mostly unsealed and four-wheel drives are recommended. There is accessibility for approximately 10-11 months of the year.

Permits

A permit is required to visit any Aboriginal land in the Northern Territory.

A permit is required to travel the Central Arnhem Road, enter Aboriginal communities or visit beaches and other recreation areas.

The people

Nhulunbuy is a multicultural community made up primarily of Northern Territory Government staff and those employed in mines and tourism.

Aboriginal Territorians and some Northern Territory Government staff mostly live in the other main communities of Milingimbi in the Crocodile Islands, Galiwin'ku on Elcho Island, Ramingining on the edge of the Arafura Swamp, Gapuwiyak on the shores of Lake Evella, and Yirrkala and Gunyangara on the Gove Peninsula.

East Arnhem residents enjoy a relaxed lifestyle with access to a large range of recreational activities and facilities. Fishing and camping are favourite weekend activities for many people.

The East Arnhem Regional Council provide services to the Gove Peninsula communities.

Aboriginal language groups

The term "language group" is used often to describe different groups of Aboriginal people because they themselves identify by their language.

Opportunities

Major industries in the East Arnhem region include mining, tourism, agriculture, space travel, aquaculture and fishing. Mining has historically been the anchor industry to economic activity in the region, with the extraction of bauxite at the Rio Tinto and Gulkula mines on the Gove Peninsula. Traditional Aboriginal cultural experiences, Aboriginal art, and the remote and natural wilderness attract tourists to the region, stimulating economic activity and providing employment opportunities.

East Arnhem is the home of the Arnhem Space Centre a commercial launch facility being developed by Equatorial Launch Australia (ELA), near Nhulunbuy. The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) launched a sounding rocket campaign from



the Arnhem Space Centre in 2022, and ELA is currently exploring opportunities for future commercial launch contracts.

For those wishing to relocate to the region there are often a range of employment opportunities available in Nhulunbuy and the East Arnhem region. To view job opportunities, visit the Gove Jobs Facebook page at facebook.com/groups/GOVEJOBS/.

Schools and Daycare

School term and holiday dates differ to other States with a longer mid-year break of 3 weeks.

There are 4 terms in the school year and, most government schools follow the same term dates with the exception of some remote schools.

School term dates are available here: nt.gov.au/ learning/primary-and-secondary-students/schoolterm-dates-in-nt.

If your child attends a non-government school, check the term dates with the school.

Territory schools generally hold classes between 8am and 3pm. All Government schools are co-educational.

In the Northern Territory there are three stages of schooling which are:

- Primary transition to Year 6
- Middle Year 7 to Year 9
- Senior Year 10 to Year 12.

There are 12 primary and secondary schools, as well as 6 early childhood and childcare schools located across the East Arnhem region. The majority of schools are public schools.

Student transfers

If transferring from one school to another, your child's records will automatically transfer between government schools in the Territory.

If your child is transferring to a non-government school, your written consent must accompany any request.

Enrolling at school

You can complete a student enrolment form online or in person at your child's new school. Enrol your child at nt.gov.au/learning/primary-and-secondarystudents/enrol-your-child-at-school.

If enrolling in preschool you must also complete the supplementary preschool enrolment form.

The Northern Territory Government, in partnership with education providers, offers Study in Australia's Northern Territory Scholarships to talented students. The scholarships are for vocational education and training, higher education, and schools.

Arts and Culture

There are several famous indigenous arts centres in East Arnhem, including the renowned Buku-Larrnggay Mulka Centre in Yirrkala, Gapuwiyak Culture and Arts, Milingimbi Art and Culture and Anindilyakwa Arts Gallery located on nearby Groote Eylandt.

Dining

The Gove Peninsula Surf Lifesaving Club was established in 1974 and offers a great dining experience. Gove also has its own pizzeria and Lattitude 12 is a great place to catch up with friends for a drink.

There are also bakeries and mobile café's. Banubanu's Seabreeze Restaurant is an elevated Pavilion overlooking the blue waters of our Western Cove. While the Waterfront Kitchen located at the Gove Boat Club on the Gove Peninsula, a short 15 minute drive from Nhulunbuy offering visitors a lovely selection of food options.

The Walkabout Tavern situated in the centre of Nhulunbuy features a sports bar, bistro, bottle shop and is the home of Nhulunbuy's nightclub come the weekend.

The Yirrkala Community Store is located opposite the Buku-Larrnggay Mulka Centre in the beautiful community of Yirrkala, 18 kilometres south-east from Nhulunbuy.

The Gove Country Golf Club, features a 9 hole golf course and Fairways restaurant and bar - all in one idyllic location.

Shopping

You can shop for all the essentials with most communities and towns including local stores. Nhulunbuy features a large Woolworths, pharmacy, newsagency, butcher and fishing tackle shop for all the everyday necessities.

The Gopu Community Store is a Yolngu managed general store located in the Gunyanara community, a 15 minute drive from Nhulunbuy stocking a range of locally produced artwork and jewellery items as well as groceries, fruit, hot lunches and great coffee!

Laynhapuy Homelands community stores operate in Gangan, Garrthalala, Wandawuy, and Baniyala/ Yilpara providing regular deliveries of fresh and healthy food and household products.

ALPA operates remote community stores in Galinwin'ku, Gapuwiyak, Milingimbi, Minjilang, Ramingining.

Local attractions

In Nhulunbuy there are over 25 clubs and associations with multiple options for both adult and youth sports and recreation.

There is a large community library, an olympic sized swimming pool, multiple playgrounds, a skate park, play group, art centres, golf, toy library and two large sporting ovals.

Other attractions include Garanhan (Macassan Beach), Buku-Larrnggay Mulka Arts Centre, Gove Boat Club, Wanuwuy (Cape Arnhem), Bawaka and Lonely Beach, Banambarrna (Rainbow Cliff), East Arnhem Islands, Wathuwuy (Goanna Lagoon) and Gapuru (Memorial Park).
